HEALTH CRISIS UPDATE

The global health crisis has affected us all in profound ways. Here at FACE, we are witnessing a dramatic trickle-down effect that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on pets and their loving families.

One of our grantees affected by the health crisis is Bow, a handsome Great Dane with a heart of gold. In March, Bow unexpectedly started retching and gagging. His parents rushed him to Pet Emergency and Specialty Center where they diagnosed him with Gastric Dilatation Volvulus (GDV), a life-threatening condition in which a pet's stomach becomes overstretched and rotated. It was clear that surgery was the only option to save Bow's life. Recently laid off with a baby on the way, his parents Mariah and Mason just didn't have the funds to pay for Bow's surgery. They asked family, friends, and exhausted every option, but they just couldn't afford Bow's life-saving medical care.



Heartbroken and without any options left, the couple reached out to FACE for assistance. After reviewing their application, Bow's case was approved and he had the surgery right away. FACE is grateful to our fantastic veterinary partner, PESCC, for discounting their costs to save Bow's life. Mariah says, "Without you, Bow might not be here today. You saved my very best friend. I was terrified and you gave me the greatest gift I've ever received, and that was saving his life. All I wanted was for our baby to meet our first baby Bow. You made that possible for us."

FACE has seen an increase of pet owners affected by the crisis reaching out for help with their pet's life-saving veterinary care. Prior to the order, only 10% of families we supported were unemployed. Since the order, this statistic has shockingly increased to over 70%.

"As we move into our 14th year serving our community with life-saving grants for their pets, we need your philanthropic help more than ever. We are 100% funded by your generous donations. We continue our mission without interruption. We honor and thank our staff who have worked virtually from their homes during these trying times. We value our veterinary partners that make it possible to save so many family pets on a daily basis. I am available 24/7 to talk about the many giving opportunities available to you. 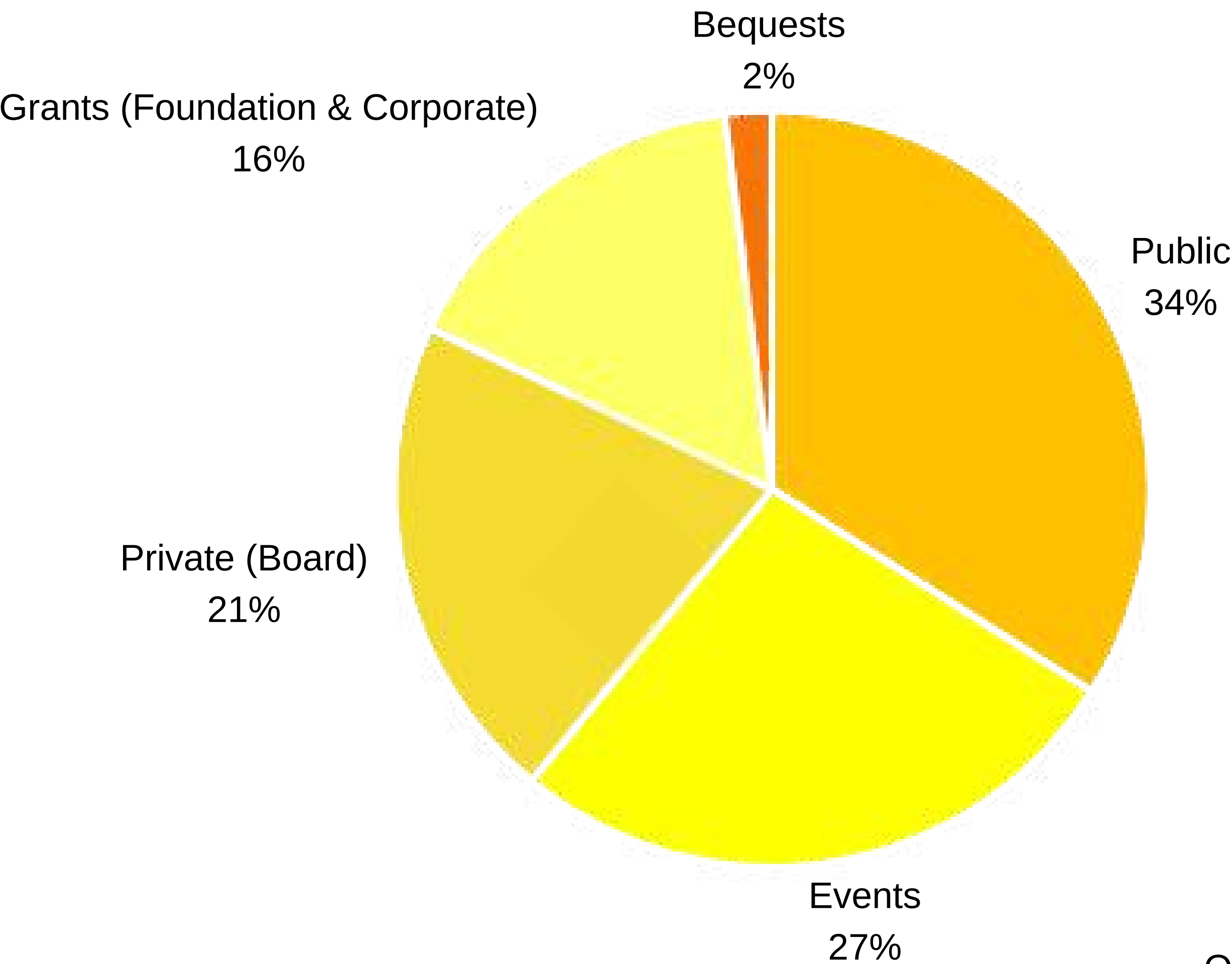

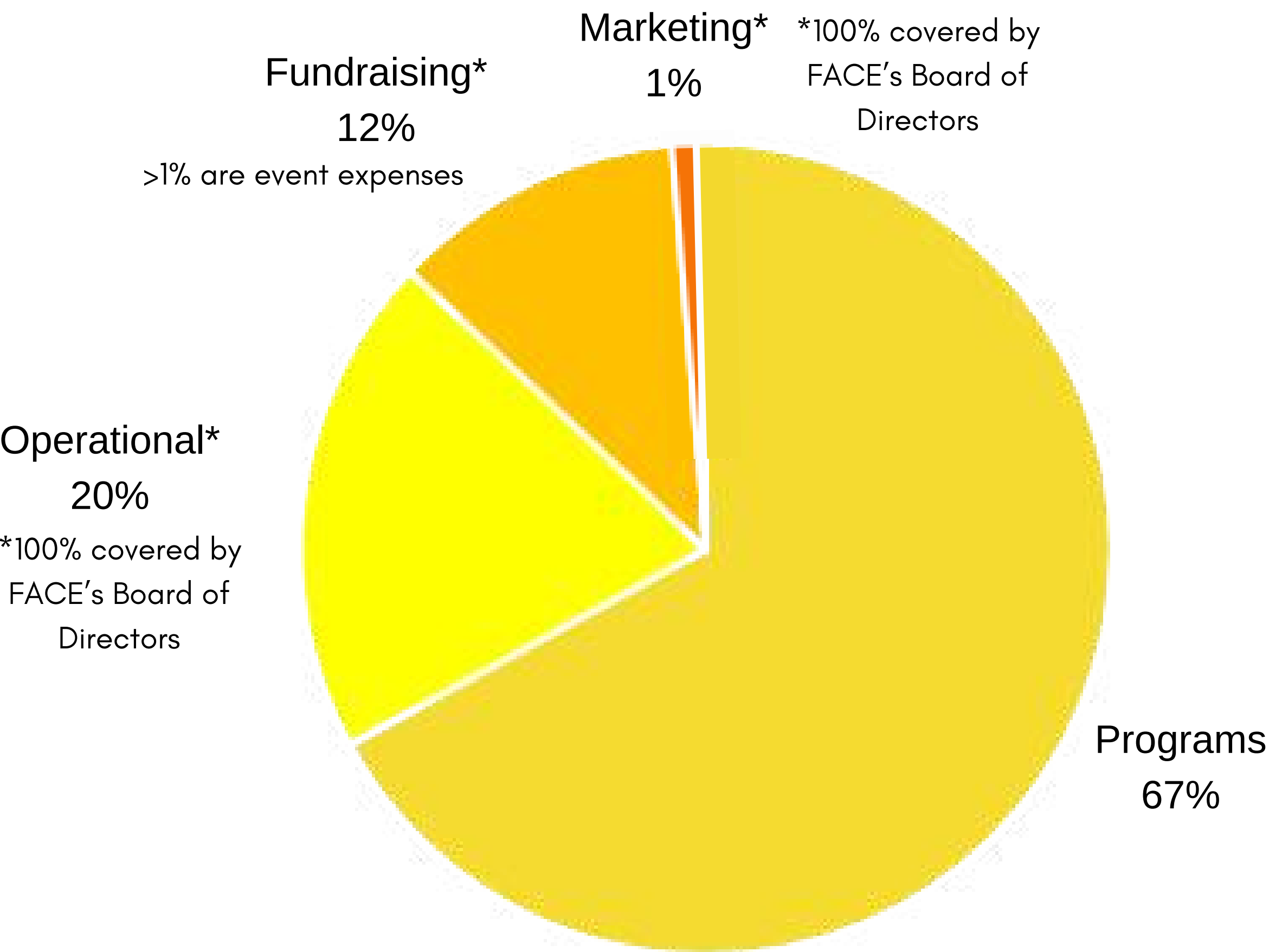

2019 MILESTONE: CELEBRATING 2,500 LIVES SAVED



FACE is celebrating a major milestone – 2,500 lives saved through our Save-A-Life Program!

Charlie, an adorable 5-year-old terrier mix, is our 2,500th life saved and we couldn't think of a more deserving pup. She came into Janine and Paul's family when she was a young pup. Paul, Janine and their two teenagers have loved Charlie and cared for her dearly ever since. Paul remembers when they first got her: "Another family said she was too needy. She was very standoffish and skittish. Over time, once she realized we weren't going to abandon her, she became more comfortable. Now, five years later, we can't imagine our lives without her."

One day, the family noticed Charlie acting lethargic, uninterested in playing, vomiting, and refusing treats – they knew something was wrong. After rushing her to the vet, it was determined that Charlie has pyometra – an infection in unspayed female dogs that if left untreated can be fatal. Her veterinarian at VCA Animal Medical Center of El Cajon recommended an emergency surgery to save Charlie. Her family never expected anything like this to happen to her, which is why educating pet owners about the health benefits to spaying and neutering is so important. They didn't have the funds to cover this life-saving procedure and were in desperate need of help. Without this surgery, Charlie wouldn't have been able to make it.

Both Janine and Paul are seniors working to make ends meet. After a major fall three years ago resulting in injury, Janine is now disabled and wheelchair bound. Her fall and injury caused Janine deep depression, making her almost unrecognizable to their entire family. Her rehabilitation therapist suggested incorporating Charlie into her rehab, and she quickly transitioned back to her old self.

Through tears, Paul told us, "I honestly credit Charlie with saving my wife's life. Though she is still wheelchair bound, Charlie helped get her through this tough time. Charlie is always by her side." Thankfully, FACE's supporters were able to raise enough funds to get Charlie the surgery she needed. She is now back at home with her loving family.

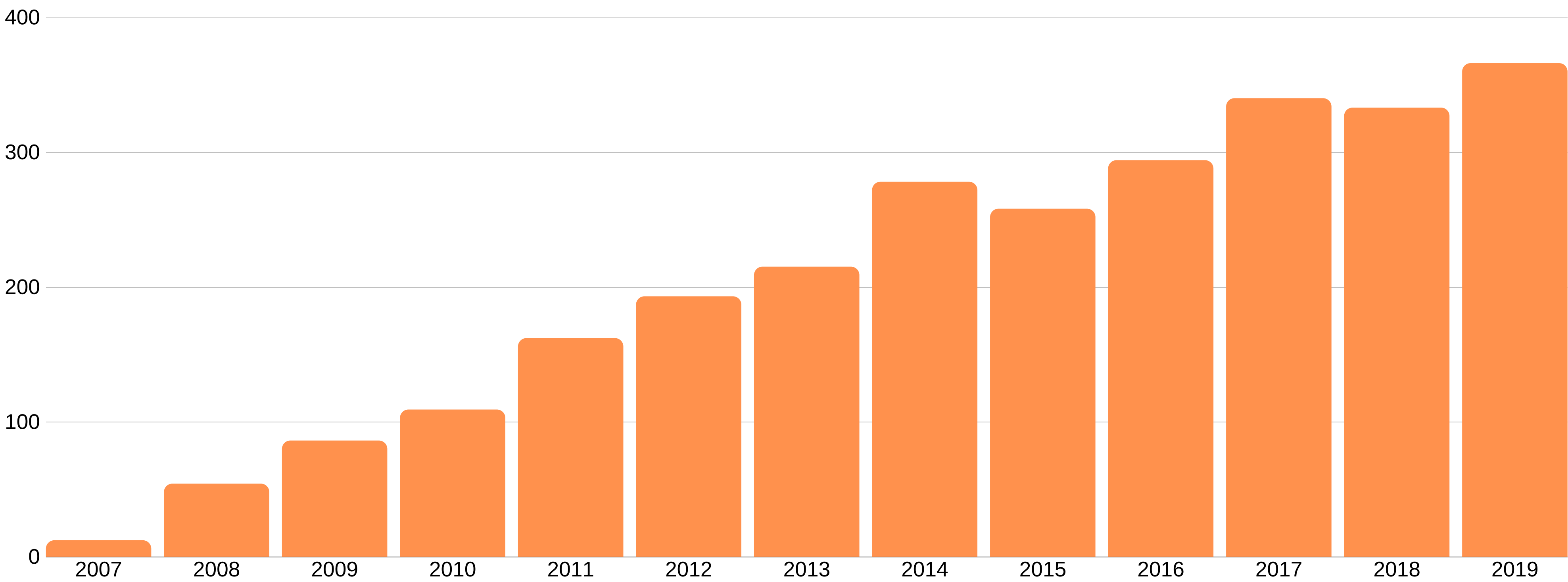

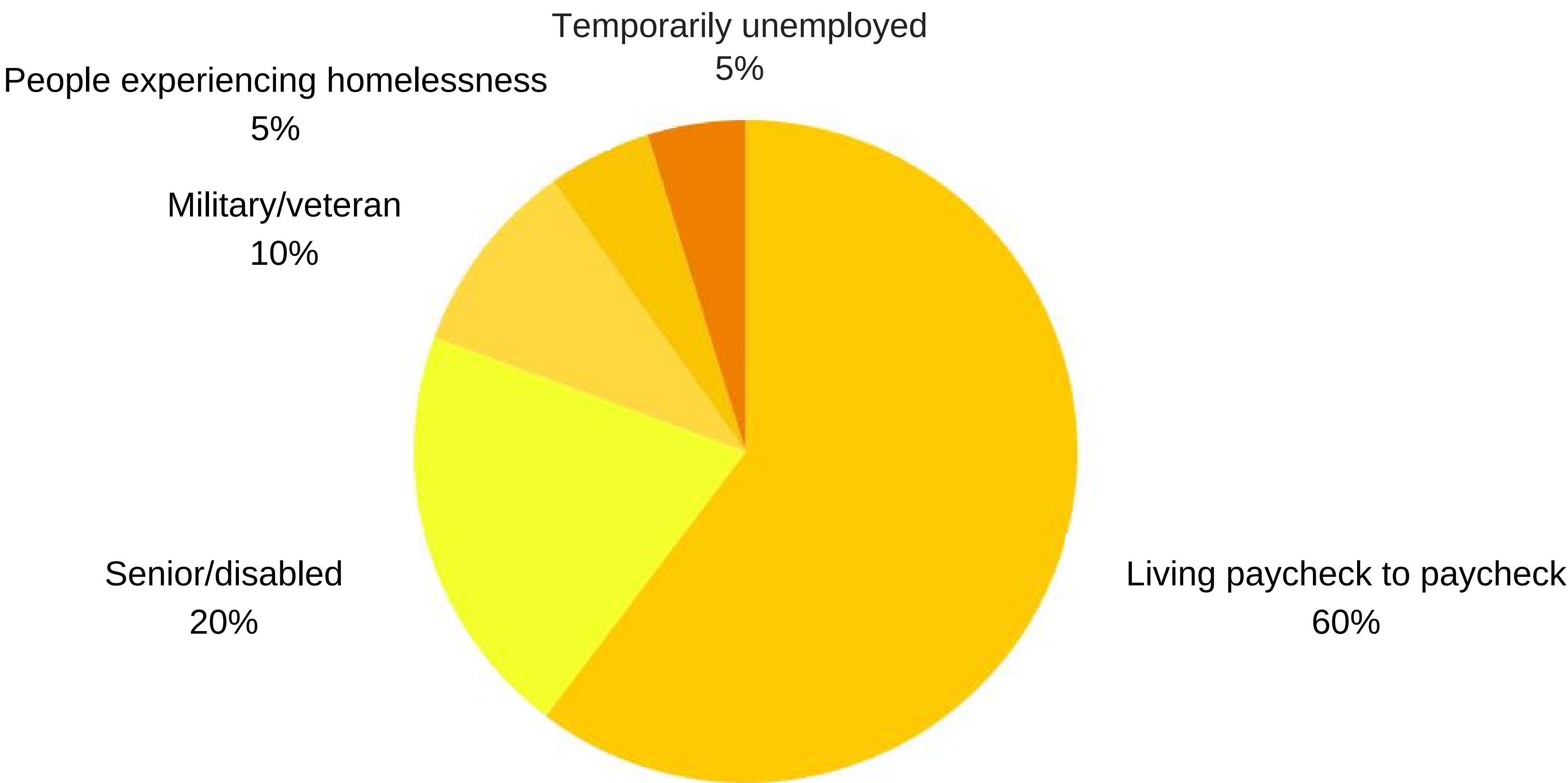

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

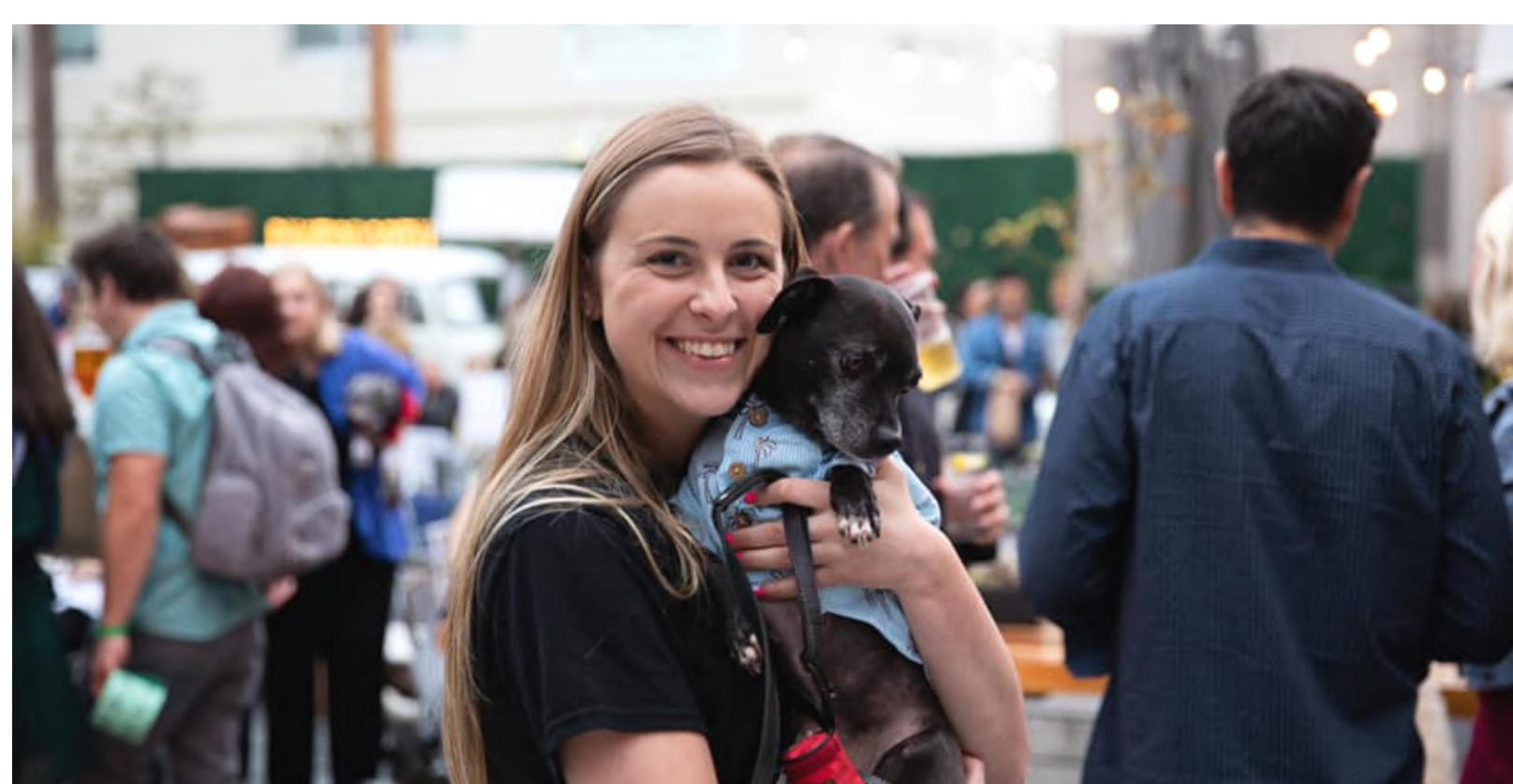

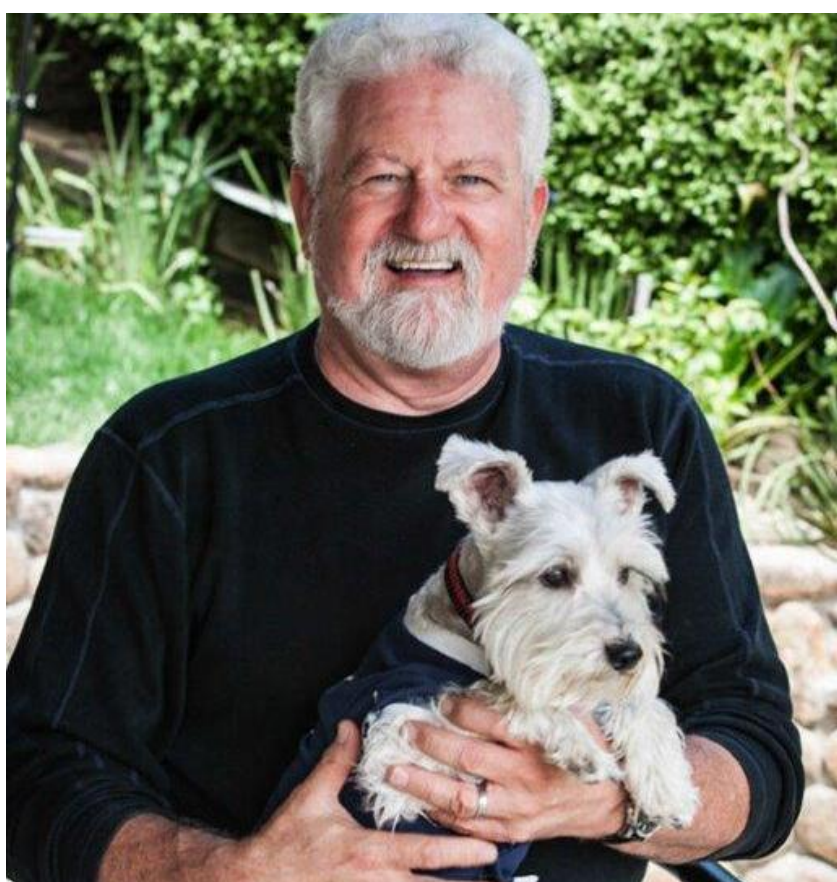
Cini Robb Co-Founder and Board President

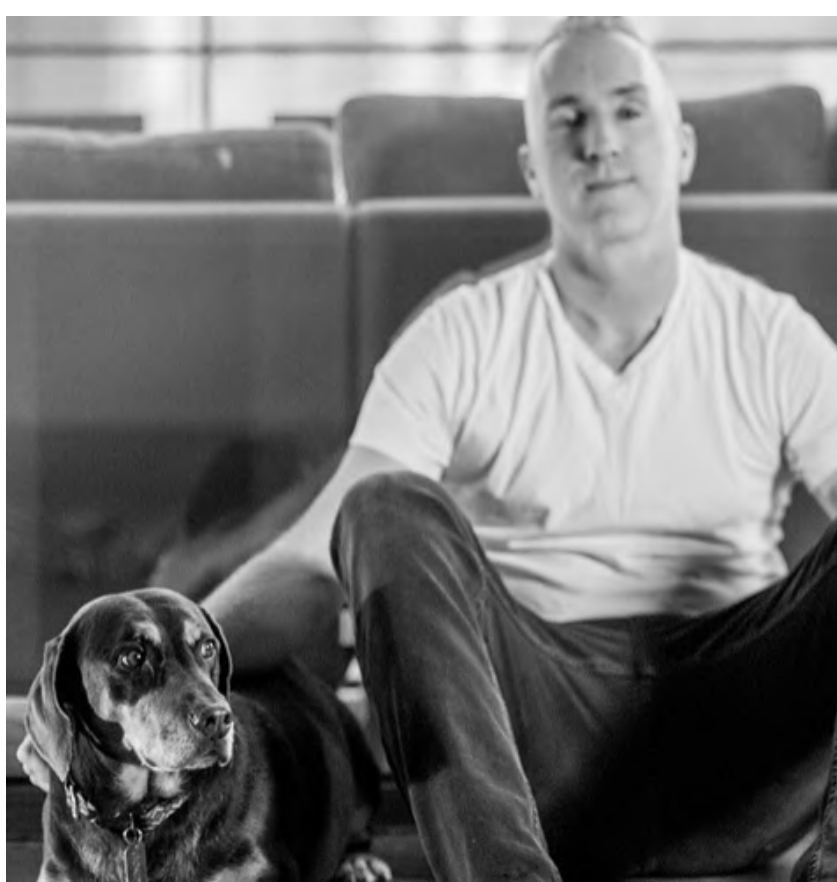
Dr. Keith Richter Chair

Dr. Tammy Stevenson Secretary

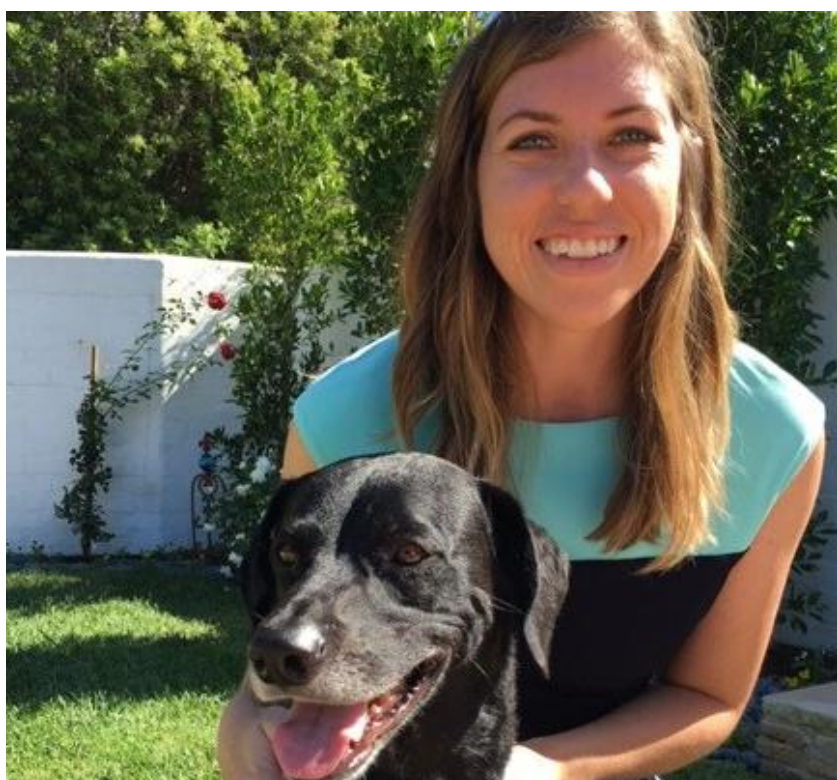

Amber N. Yoo, MBA Director

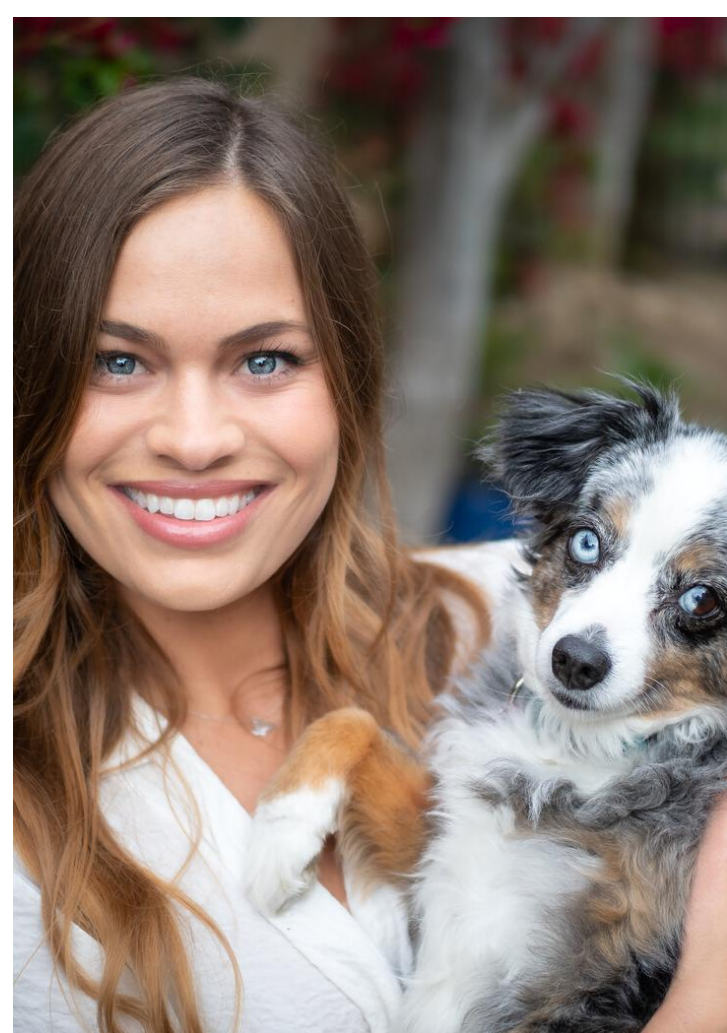

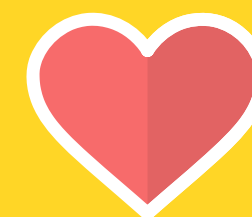

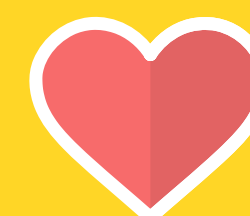
